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### Profile and research interests

Since the start of my academic career my research interest has been on developing a better understanding of physicians' supply of health care to patients. My research is based on quantitative analyses using data from both administrative and clinical registers, surveys, and computer-based laboratory experiments. My studies are published in top field journals within health economics (e.g. *Journal of Health Economics*, *Health Economics*, and *Social Science & Medicine*). I have successfully conducted and led several large-scaled research projects using Danish healthcare data. Currently, I am the principal investigator on the data-driven research project "The WELLCARE project" as part of The Carlsberg Foundation's Semper Ardens: Accelerate grant (DKK 4,291,478). I have also previously worked on assignments for both *The Danish Regions* and *The Danish Ministry of Health*. Currently, I am employed as an advisor to the Danish council for remuneration of general practices.
